- · Increased elective opportunities by 60%. Students will all either begin or end day with an elective course.

- · Alignment of our ELA and Math curriculum to meet CCSS and increase teacher effectiveness and student learning.
- · Adoption of a new math curriculum with an integrated methodology approach.
- · Creation of parent and student focus groups to enhance our climate and culture and improve student attendance.
- · Once a month focus on service- learning, extended academic opportunities, and work force development. All students will be off-campus engaged in an activity on this day.


