We are improving our literary skills in many different ways here at Albany Options. In our ROCKS program we are writing children's stories to be given out to all of the elementary schools in our district. The theme for the book is based upon our ROCKS - Respect, Ownership, Courage, Knowledge, and Safety. Students are creating short stories, poems, and song lyrics in a bound book to present to the schools. This is an amazing endeavor and gift for our students and the elementary students in our district.

We have started up again

this year with the Jet Restoration project in conjunction with Historic Albany Restoration Project (HARP) and the Albany Municipal Airport. The students work at the airport on Saturdays with veteran pilots to restore Vietnam era jet planes that will go up on display in front of the airport along the I-5 corridor.

What's Happening in Leadership Class...

The Leadership class has been doing some great things at AOS. Last month they began volunteering at Regency of Albany retirement home. The students are spending their class period every Friday with the seniors.

Students help out by spending time chatting with the seniors, setting up games and activities, and helping with their Friday afternoon BINGO games.

The students have also been working to coordinate a book drive, which will go to elementary school students. The students understand the importance of reading and writing if you ever want to graduate, so they are trying to make a difference for the younger students in the community by providing them with books so that they may read at home.

Many families in our community cannot afford books to read to their children, so in an effort to promote literacy our students are bringing books to the students.

The students have set up drop-sites for members in the community to donate

books including one at AOS. Please support their efforts by bringing in lightly used or new children's books.

Central Willamette Community Credit Union is showing their support for our efforts by donating \$300 to the cause, and Goodwill is donating books as part of the effort. Drop-off sites will be announced on our school website and FaceBook page when we return from Spring Break.

Joys of Living Assistance Dogs Visit Lit Class

For a second year in a row the Joys of Living Assistance Dogs organization has returned to work with students in Ms. Kozak's Young Adult Lit class.

The organization works with dogs from the moment they are born to train them to



be service dogs for persons with physical disabilities.

The students spent their class period on Tuesday, March 19th working with 4-week-old puppies to help socialize them and work on positive association. Students also helped the puppies develop basic skills like sitting

on command and working to develop their hind leg coordination.

They will return two more times with service dogs at different ages and stages of training.



Jet Restoration Returns to AOS!

Jet Restoration has returned to Albany Options this Spring and students are once again spending their Saturdays gutting old Vietnam War jet planes and preparing them to go



up on display along the I-5 corridor in front of the Albany Municipal Airport.

For every 32 hours spent working on the jets the students are earning 0.25 Elective Credits through the Cooperative Work Experience program as well as valuable work experience.

The students are working with veteran pilots who flew similar jets when they were in the service!
