Mock Trial Class Takes Case to Courthouse

Mr. Wolfe's Mock Trial class spent the last grading period preparing for the case of U.S. vs. Dominique Stephens, a woman who admits to shooting and killing her husband and is charged with first degree murder.



The students studied the case through and through and were given the roles of the characters in the case.

On March 11th, the students went to the Linn County Court-

house, where they performed the mock trial in a courtroom.

Six individuals from the community attended and played the role of jurors, while Mr. Wolfe presided as the judge.

Students cross-examined each other as lawyers as well as played the role of witnesses for both the prosecution



and defense.

In the end the jury had the extremely difficult job of deliberating. They ultimately ruled that Dominique Stephens, enacted by student Samantha Tolman, was guilty of murder in the first degree.

Everyone who experi-



enced the mock trial was blown away by how well the students performed, their thorough questioning, and outstanding responses.

Jessica Harlin, (pictured left) was recognized the following week as the Outstanding Mock Trial Student at the school-wide assembly for her exemplary work in the class and stunning performance.

Ecology Guests from City of Albany

Ecology Class spent the last six-week grading period learning about endangered species in the Willamette Valley and around the world. The students studied the causes for endangerment, the role humans play on the issue, and what can be done to improve the situation.

Kim Kegalaris from the City of Albany Environmental Services and Meghan Chuites from Parks and Rec visited the class on Friday, March 7th.

Kim spoke to the students about storm water runoff and its negative

impacts, and Meghan shared about native plants being used in city parks.
