Amnesty International ROCKS AOS

This past term AOS used the ROCKS period every Thursday to focus on making a difference around the world through Amnesty International's Global Write-a-Thon event.

Students took the opportunity to improve margin note taking while reading about specific human rights violations in multiple different countries. Students chose individuals and

causes and wrote letters to officials calling for change.



Some students even had the opportunity to write a

letter to the victim encouraging them to continue fighting for human rights in their country.

This is the second year AOS has participated in the Write for Rights letter writing campaign hosted by Amnesty International. Students shared their letters and the stories of the victims they had studied at an assembly on January 24th.

Playhouse Structure Completed for Habitat

Last Spring AOS was awarded a Service Learning grant from Habitat for Humanity International and State Farm to build a playhouse structure. The grant, worth \$5000, was only awarded to nine schools across the country!

Students at AOS met every Saturday during the last trimester to build the project, which is going to a local church in our community.

This project was part of the "Service Saturdays" program, which provides students with the opportunity to earn additional credits outside of their regular school day.

Students involved in this project were able to earn .25-.5 Elective credits based on the numbers of hours they worked.

The grant is also paying for the school's Service Learning coordinator, Anna Sokolov, to attend the National



Service Learning Conference in Denver, CO later this Spring to help further Service Learning at AOS.


