#### Summer School

This year, due to the snow days, out school year was extended, which cut into our Summer School time.

We will be having Summer School for just one week from June 23rd to the 27th.

There will be two class sessions offered, a morning AM class, and an afternoon PM class. Students have the option of signing up for one of both sessions. Each class session will be worth .25 credits.

## Upcoming Service Learning Projects for AOS

Later this month, the Ecology class will be taking their skills and knowledge and using it to support another organization, the Cornerstone Youth Outreach Center.

The Youth Outreach Center is a youth drop-in center located in Albany, and is a collaboration between Faith Lutheran Church and Jackson Street Youth Shelter, Inc. It serves as a drop-in facility for youth who need a safe place to spend some time, need food, supplies, help with school, or assistance getting a job. It hopes to continue working towards

becoming a full youth shelter.

The Ecology students will be building raised beds to start a garden at the Outreach Center. The students will build the raised beds and use starts from our greenhouse to begin their garden.

The students have also been painting garden vegetable signs as well
