> The Theater students also spent a Saturday at Albany Civic Theater doing a Service Learning project. The students helped create the set for their production of the Wizard of Oz.



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Junior Seminar to Help Prepare Students

The week of May 13th Juniors begin testing on the Smarter Balanced math performance task. This assessment involves a "real world" problem that students will solve mathematically, justifying their work as they go.

After they have completed this task, they will move on to the computer-based assessment of a variety of mathematical concepts.

Once the math portion is finished, students will proceed to the English side of the test.

This term we have built a prep-class into our schedule for Juniors to feel more prepared for these assessments. They spend half of their time working on a variety of math tasks and concepts, and the other half preparing for the English part.

Students have been given opportuni-

ties to try Smarter Balanced practice questions, use the computer tools that are available, work through performance tasks, and practice defending their reasoning as they go.

The goal of the class is to have every student prepared to give the test their best shot. We're looking forward to seeing how well they can do with this new assessment.
