## Guest Speaker in Street Law Class

Whitney Perez, a Salem lawyer who represented a woman who killed her husband and claimed Battered Woman Syndrome, came to Mr. Wolfe's Street Law class to speak about that case and other legal matters.

Ms. Perez's presentation was timely because Mr. Wolfe's students were in the midst of writing a judge's opinion on another Battered

Woman Syndrome case in which a woman who, after years of abuse at the hands of her husband, shoots and kills him while he is sleeping in bed.

Ms. Perez's interesting talk helped the students more clearly understand the role of



public defenders, especially in Battered Woman Syndrome cases.

The class also learned a great deal about the grand jury process, plea bargaining and pre-trial police investigations.

## Student Article: Leadership Happenings

The Spring Leadership class is adding new plans to our agenda. Not only do we have a first time Leadership teacher, Mr. Corliss, but we changed to having leadership in the afternoon which expands some of the things we are able to do.

We have added a weekly Service Learning project, where we go to Sunrise Park and do some community service including cleaning up spray paint from the structures, picking up trash around the park, and weeding.

In the classroom we have a different student take control of the lesson plan, lead the discussions, and play "teacher" for the class each day.

This has shown an improvement in the students behavior towards others, and towards themselves. They've learned a lot more about being a leader and a follower in the necessary times.

The Leadership class has been planning upcoming events like Spirit Week, where students are responsible for the specific days and activities, the Night of the Knights, Teacher Appreciation Week, and more.

I love being in Leadership because it

has allowed me to make new friends in the school that I would not have gotten to know otherwise. It's a really positive way for me to end my day. I always leave in a good mood. It has also shown me how to let others step up and be leaders. ## Forensic Science: Learning to Solve Crimes

Crime Scene investigation has become increasingly popular and with TV shows like CSI, Bones and Law and Order, We thought why not incorpo-

rate these hot topics into a science class?

Mrs. Gillispie is teaching a Forensics class where, this last term, the students learned about blood times, ink chromatography, and

how to compare handwriting samples. The final for this class incorporated all these topics into one final crime scene investigation.

> A student agreed to play the victim in a mysterious crime that can be seen in the image. With a note left at the crime scene and blood times to be detected, the students had to create a list of

suspects, questioning, and investigated the evidence. For their final product they turned in an analysis of who committed the crime and what evidence they had to support it.

The Forensics class is continuing this term by studying fingerprints, shoe impressions, as well as hair and fiber analysis. The final will be similar to last term, but the evidence will pertain to the materials the students have been learning.
