
Fees and Dues:

Last months AOS was visited by crews from the PBS program, "This American Land" as they shots segments for an upcoming episode in their third season this Summer.

Last year AOS received a \$500 grant from the Captain Planet Foundation to continue efforts on the bioswale behind the building. With the funds the school has been able to purchase plants from Native Grounds Nursery in Brownsville.

A bioswale is a low-lying piece of land that serves as a collecting spot for

rainwater during the wet seasons.

The students have learned how they can help reduce the school's impact on the watershed and also help cut down the water pollution going into our waterways

through planting native plants designed to live in such conditions.

The episode will be broadcast near the end of the Summer. AOS will be sure to spread the word so everyone will have the opportunity to see it.
