AOS Introduces "Service Saturdays"

AOS is always looking for ways for students to earn credits outside of the classroom during the school year. Last year many students took advantage of these opportunities and earned credits through cadet teaching, volunteering, restoring jet war planes, and through their jobs.

This year AOS is introducing "Service Saturdays," which will be an opportunity for students to meet on the weekends for special credit earning opportunities. The school intends to

provide a whole variety of activities ranging from a wood shop series, trips to the coast, work days at the school, and more.

Students will earn credits participating in these activities through the Cooperative Work Experience (Co-Op) curriculum. Students who participate will earn hours towards credits. For every 32 hours a student will earn .25 Elective credits. These hours can be added to other volunteer and Co-Op hours. Regular announcements about

these opportunities will be sent out and Service Saturdays will be added to the school calendar.

We are excited to begin our weekends together and hope the students take advantage of all of the opportunities.

The next Service Saturday will be at AOS on October 6th.

Students will work on the bioswale during the day.

an outreach center for youth ages 12-


CYOC offers services such as helping students register for school, complete their homework, create cover letters and resumes, as well as provide youth with food and other basic necessities.
