Leadership Club Fundraises for Trip to Costa Rical

Students from AOS have partnered up outside of school to raise money for a trip to Costa Rica later this Spring.

The students will be participating on a ten-day tour of Costa Rica where they will help reforest mangroves along the coastlines, which were ruined due to the rubber industry.

The students are receiving assistance from teacher Holly Mitchell and the school's Business to School Liaison Anna Harryman who are volunteering in their free time to help the students reach their fundraising and planning goals. The students are responsible for raising all of the funds to cover the cost, which is over \$2,500 per student.
