
Students Attend National CTE Signing Day at LBCC

It is that time of year for our seniors to really be finalizing their plans after graduation. Many have been accepted into colleges or programs, but have much more yet to do.

Please check out the following list of things you should be doing. If there is something you need assistance with, please do not hesitate to contact me:

Completed the FAFSA (fafsa.gov)
if you plan on attending any college next year. You cannot get any

financial aid without completing the FAFSA

- If you do not qualify for the FAF-SA, you should apply for the OR-SAA (oregonstudentaid.gov)
- If you plan to attend community college or WOU, complete the Oregon Promise (oregonstudentaid.gov/Oregonpromise.aspx)
- Apply to LBCC (linnbenton.edu)

- Meet with Harryman to share your plans and discuss possible scholarships
- Apply for scholarships

Financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis, so it is important that you complete the FAFSA, ORSAA, and Oregon Promise as soon as possible. It doesn't cost anything to apply, so even if unsure of your plans, please take the time to apply. Please see me with any questions.
