Dear graduating seniors, it may seem like graduation is far off in the future, but it will be here before you know it. We are in the second half of your senior year and will be

wrapping up your high school career before you know it.

1. Track your credits! You are given a copy of your transcript every six-week grading period. Know what it means

to be on track. If unsure or lost your transcript, come see me right away. If you are not on track, make sure you have a plan for how you are going to get back on track to graduate this year.

2. Order your cap and gown for the graduation ceremony, June 10, 2019. Miners Graduate

Services is our providers. See the insert for deadlines!

3. Return all books – Here at AOS,

and at your referring school.

4. You must have all of your work completed for your classes and all fines paid by June 7, 2019, by 3:30pm.

5. Complete the FAFSA and "Oregon Promise" application. Check in with me if you would like to set up an appointment to get your applications done with her help. When completed, make sure you show me so that you can

be put on her scholar-

ship recipient list.

6. Get at least one letter of recommendation from an adult who knows you (but not your parent). Don't wait until the last minute for a letter, and don't wait until next year when the teachers may not remember

as much about you.

7. Make sure you have a current copy

of your resume, which includes a list of activities you participated in while at AOS.

GRADUATION

Graduation is June 10th at 7pm in the Russell Tripp Theater at LBCC.

Last day for seniors is Friday, June 7th. Senior Awards and Senior BBQ will be that day as well. 8. Meet with me to discuss your post-secondary plans. Make sure you leave AOS with a plan in place!

9. Turn in a copy of a picture of you as a baby and turn it in to me for the graduation slideshow. The larger the picture the better. If you bring it in to the school, one of the ladies at the front desk can scan it in and send

AOS Gets 3D Printer

Recently, the school received a 3D printer thanks to additional funding through Measure 98, which allots money to schools to be spent on career

and technical education.

Classes using the 3D printer include Digital Media, Construction Math, and Art.

Currently, the Digital Media class is learning to use Tinkercad to design and produce keychains.

Students will be able to print objects they design to an accuracy of a tenth of a millimeter.



In the spring term, Construction Math will start using the 3D printer to generate small-scale models of larger projects so that the students can see the end result before the project is even started.
