# Financial Aid: FAFSA and OR Promise

Seniors and GED students, you should be already be working on your plans for after you complete your education

If you plan on attending any kind of post-high school education, please complete the FAFSA.

**FAFSA** stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid, and is the form you complete in order to apply for financial aid for college and career school.

# You can access it at fafsa.gov.

Mrs. Harryman is available for inperson appointments to assist students and families with completing the FAFSA, OR Promise, and college applications.

The FAFSA opened October 1st, so do not wait to complete it.

If you need assistance completing the FAFSA, please reach out to Mrs. Harryman. If you need assistance in Spanish, please contact Mr. Diaz.

The Oregon Promise is another funding opportunity for students planning on attending community college and can be completed online at: <a href="https://oregonstudentaid.gov/oregon-promise.aspx">https://oregonstudentaid.gov/oregon-promise.aspx</a>.
